- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Brothers of St. short title. Gabriel Ordinance.
- 2.—(1) The Reverend Brother Vincent, the Titular The Titular Superior of the Congregation of the Brothers of Christian Instruction of St. Gabriel, in the Colony of Singapore, and gation of his successors in office, shall be a body corporate, hereinafter called "the Corporation", and shall for the St. Gabriel purposes of this Ordinance, have the name of "The Titular in the Superior of the Brothers of St. Gabriel in Singapore", and by that name, have perpetual succession, and shall and may have and use a corporate seal.
- (2) The said seal may from time to time be broken, changed or altered or made anew as to the corporation seems fit.

(3) The expression "successors in office" shall be deemed to include the Brother Procurator from the time when the office of "The Titular Superior of the Brothers of St. Gabriel in Singapore" becomes vacant by the resignation or death of the holder for the time being until the formal assumption of office by his successor.

Power to acquire and dispose of property.

- 3.—(1) The corporation may acquire, purchase, take, hold and enjoy movable and immovable property of every description, and may sell, convey, assign, exchange, surrender, yield up, mortgage, demise, re-assign, transfer or otherwise dispose of any movable or immovable property vested in the corporation upon such terms as to the corporation seems fit.
- (2) The corporation may sue and be sued in respect of such property in any of the Courts of the Colony of Singapore.

Execution of documents.

4.—(1) All deeds, documents and other instruments requiring the seal of the corporation shall be sealed with the seal of the corporation in the presence of the person who is the Titular Superior for the time being of the Congregation of the Brothers of Christian Instruction of St. Gabriel in Singapore, or when the office is vacant, in the presence of the Brother Procurator or of the Attorney of any one of them duly authorized by a Power of Attorney deposited under section 48 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Ordinance, and shall also be signed by the said Titular Superior for the time being of the Congregation of the Brothers of Christian Instruction of St. Gabriel or by the Brother Procurator as the case may be or the Attorney of any one of them so authorized as aforesaid.

(2) Such signing shall be and be taken as sufficient evidence that the said seal was duly and properly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the corporation.

Notification of appointment of Titular Superior of the congregation of the Brothers of Christian Instruction of St. Gabriel.

5. A notification in the *Gazette* of the appointment of any person to exercise the office of Titular Superior of the Congregation of the Brothers of Christian Instruction of St. Gabriel in the Colony of Singapore or of the Brother Procurator shall be conclusive evidence that such person was duly authorized to exercise the said office in the Colony of Singapore.

6. Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall affect the saving of rights of Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors, all bodies politic and corporate, and all others, except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from and under them.
