ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

Section.

1. Short title.
2. Statutory Declarations Act (U.K.) 1835 c. 62 deemed to be in force in Singapore.
3. Form in Schedule sufficient.
4. False declaration to be punishable under Penal Code.
The Schedule — Form of declaration.

An Act to remove doubts concerning statutory declarations.

[28th August 1885]

1. This Act may be cited as the Statutory Declarations Act. Short title.

2. The Imperial Act known as the Statutory Declarations Act 1835 shall be deemed to be and to have been from the date of the passing thereof in force in Singapore. Statutory Declarations Act (U.K.) 1835 c. 62 deemed to be in force in Singapore.

3. A declaration made in the form in the Schedule to this Act shall be deemed to be a declaration made by virtue of the provisions of the Statutory Declarations Act 1835 and shall be sufficient for all purposes. Form in Schedule sufficient.

4. Declarations purporting to be made by virtue of the provisions of the Statutory Declarations Act 1835 shall be deemed to be such declarations as are referred to in sections 199 and 200 of the Penal Code. False declaration to be punishable under Penal Code. Cap. 224.
