COMMON GAMING HOUSES (EXEMPTION) (NO. 7) NOTIFICATION 2013

ARRANGEMENT OF PARAGRAPHS

- 2. Exemption The Schedule

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 24 of the Common Gaming Houses Act, the Minister for Home Affairs hereby makes the following Notification:

Citation

1. This Notification may be cited as the Common Gaming Houses (Exemption) (No. 7) Notification 2013.

Exemption

2.—(1) The Minister hereby exempts Tiong Bahru Senior Citizens' Executive Committee (referred to in this Notification as "the organiser") from the provisions of the Act in respect of the "Tiong Bahru SCEC Mahjong Competition" to be held on 10th March 2013 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the multi-purpose hall of Tiong Bahru Community Club.

(2) The exemption is subject to compliance by the organiser with the conditions specified in the Schedule.

THE SCHEDULE

Paragraph 2

CONDITIONS

- 1. The only game played shall be mahjong.
- 2. All players, spectators and staff must be at least 21 years of age.
- 3. Prize sponsors must not be involved in any business related to gambling.
- 4. Advertising for the mahjong competition shall be confined to posters and banners displayed within the Tiong Bahru Constituency.
- 5. The organiser may charge a registration fee of \$10 for covering the cost of hosting the event, less the value of the prizes.
- 6. Token prizes can be allowed in recognition of the skills shown by the winners.
- 7. The organiser shall ensure that the rules of the game are explained clearly to all players before the start of the event.
- 8. The organiser shall deploy umpires on site to referee the event and resolve any disputes.
- 9. The mahjong activities shall be held indoors at the multi-purpose hall of Tiong Bahru Community Club.
- 10. The multi-purpose hall of Tiong Bahru Community Club must have adequate sound-proofing to minimise noise pollution.
- 11. The organiser must open up the premises for spot-checks by the police during the event.
- 12. The organiser must take all reasonable steps to ensure that there are no private deals or side-betting throughout the event.
