INFECTIOUS DISEASES ACT 1976

INFECTIOUS DISEASES (COVID-19 CLEARANCE) (AMENDMENT NO. 3) REGULATIONS 2023

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 73(1) of the Infectious Diseases Act 1976, the Minister for Health makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations are the Infectious Diseases (COVID-19 Clearance) (Amendment No. 3) Regulations 2023 and come into operation on 26 June 2023.

Amendment of regulation 2

- **2.** In the Infectious Diseases (COVID-19 Clearance) Regulations 2021 (G.N. No. S 273/2021), in regulation 2(1)
 - (a) in the definition of "approved test provider", in paragraph (a), delete "or" at the end;
 - (b) in the definition of "approved test provider", in paragraph (b), insert "or" at the end;
 - (c) in the definition of "approved test provider", after paragraph (b), insert
 - "(c) who is authorised by a licence under the Healthcare Services Act 2020 to provide any licensable healthcare service that includes the provision of an approved test;";
 - (d) in the definition of "corresponding foreign authority", in paragraph (a), replace "Director" with "Director-General of Health";

- (e) in the definition of "corresponding foreign authority", in paragraph (a)(ii), delete "or" at the end; and
- (f) in the definition of "corresponding foreign authority", in paragraph (a), after sub-paragraph (iii), insert
 - "(iv) under the Healthcare Services Act 2020 of granting licences to persons to provide licensable healthcare services in that foreign country; or".
