## ROAD TRAFFIC (OCBC CYCLE 2024 — EXEMPTION) (NO. 2) ORDER 2024

### ARRANGEMENT OF PARAGRAPHS

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 142 of the Road Traffic Act 1961, the Minister for Home Affairs makes the following Order:

### Citation and period in force

- **1.**—(1) This Order is the Road Traffic (OCBC Cycle 2024 Exemption) (No. 2) Order 2024.
  - (2) This Order is in force on 11 and 12 May 2024.

### **Definitions**

- 2. In this Order
  - "specified event" means the OCBC Cycle 2024 event organised by PICH Event Management Pte. Ltd. (UEN 201420877R) on 11 and 12 May 2024;
  - "specified road" means any of the roads delineated by the black-coloured lines in the maps set out in the Schedule.

### **Exemption for riding bicycle**

- **3.** Rules 5, 6, 7, 7A, 8, 10 and 11 of the Road Traffic (Bicycles, Three-wheeled Pedal Cycles, Trishaws and Recumbent Devices Road Conduct) Rules (R 3) do not apply to an individual who rides a bicycle on a specified road during and for the purpose of the specified event under the following conditions:
  - (a) the individual is registered with PICH Event Management Pte. Ltd. as a participant of the specified event;
  - (b) there is in force, at any time the bicycle is ridden during and for the purpose of the specified event, a policy of insurance in relation to the bicycle insuring against any liability in respect of
    - (i) the death of or bodily injury sustained by any person (other than the rider of the bicycle); and
    - (ii) any property damage suffered by any person (other than the rider of the bicycle),

caused by or arising out of the use of the bicycle;

(c) the risk under the policy of insurance mentioned in sub-paragraph (b) is assumed by an insurer who, at the time the policy is issued, is lawfully carrying on an insurance business in Singapore.




MAP 1
