In exercise of the powers conferred by section 21 of the Wildlife Act, the Minister for National Development makes the following Rules:

Citation and commencement

1. These Rules are the Wildlife (Protected Wildlife Species) Rules 2020 and come into operation on 1 June 2020.

Protected wildlife species

2. The wildlife species specified in the Schedule are protected wildlife species for the purposes of the Act.

Rule 2

PROTECTED WILDLIFE SPECIES

Interpretation of Schedule

1. A protected wildlife species is specified in this Schedule —
 - (a) by the name of the species; or
 - (b) as referring to all the species in a higher taxon.
2. The abbreviation “spp.” denotes all the species in a higher taxon.
3. The common names of the protected wildlife species are included in this Schedule for reference only.
4. The headings of the Parts of this Schedule are for purposes of information or classification only.
