REGULATION OF IMPORTS AND EXPORTS
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2017

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Regulation of Imports and Exports Act, the Minister for Trade and Industry (Trade) makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations are the Regulation of Imports and Exports (Amendment) Regulations 2017 and come into operation on 31 July 2017.

Amendment of regulation 6

2. Regulation 6 of the Regulation of Imports and Exports Regulations (Rg 1) (called in these Regulations the principal Regulations) is amended —

- (a) by inserting, immediately after the words “exportation from” in paragraph (1)(b), the words “, transshipment in”;
- (b) by inserting the word “or” at the end of paragraph (2)(b); and
- (c) by deleting sub-paragraphs (c) and (d) of paragraph (2) and substituting the following sub-paragraph:
 - “(c) in relation to a country or territory specified in the first column of the Seventh Schedule —
 - (i) importation into, transshipment in, or transit through, Singapore of any goods falling within the class or description specified in the second column of that Schedule from that country or territory, whether or not the goods originated from that country or territory; or

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- (ii) exportation from, transshipment in, or transit through, Singapore of any goods falling within the class or description specified in the third column of that Schedule, if the destination is or is intended to be that country or territory, whether or not the goods originated in Singapore.”.

Deletion of Fourth Schedule

3. The Fourth Schedule to the principal Regulations is deleted.

Deletion and substitution of Seventh Schedule

4. The Seventh Schedule to the principal Regulations is deleted and the following Schedule substituted therefor:

PART 2

DEFINITIONS

In this Schedule —

“arms and related matériel” includes any of the following items:

- (a) weapons;
- (b) ammunition;
- (c) battle tanks, armoured combat vehicles and other military vehicles;
- (d) military equipment;
- (e) paramilitary equipment;
- (f) any arms as defined by the United Nations Register of Conventional Arms such as large calibre artillery systems, combat aircraft, attack helicopters, warships and missiles or missile systems;
- (g) spare parts of any arms and related matériel.

“resolution” means a resolution of the Security Council of the United Nations.”.
