In exercise of the powers conferred by section 24 of the Common Gaming Houses Act, the Minister for Home Affairs makes the following Notification:

Citation

1. This Notification is the Common Gaming Houses (Mahjong Networking Session 2019 — Exemption) Notification 2019.

Exemption

2.—(1) The Minister exempts Kampong Ubi Community Centre Senior Citizens' Executive Committee (called in this Notification the organiser) from the provisions of the Act in respect of —

- (a) the “Mahjong Networking Session 2019” promotion to be held from 1 July 2019 to 29 September 2019 (both dates inclusive); and
- (b) the mahjong games to be held at the multi-purpose hall of Kampong Ubi Community Centre from 8.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. on 29 September 2019.

(2) The exemption is subject to compliance by the organiser with the conditions specified in the Schedule.

THE SCHEDULE

Paragraph 2

CONDITIONS

1. The only game played must be mahjong.
2. All players must be at least 21 years of age and residing in the Marine Parade Group Representation Constituency.
3. All spectators and staff must be at least 21 years of age.
4. Prize sponsors must not be involved in any business related to gambling.
5. Advertising for the mahjong competition must be confined to posters and banners displayed in such area within the Marine Parade Group Representation Constituency as is designated by the organiser to be the Kembangan-Chai Chee district.
6. The organiser may charge each player an entrance fee of \$22 to cover the cost of hosting the mahjong competition, less the value of the prizes.
7. Token prizes can be allowed in recognition of the skills shown by the winners.
8. The organiser must ensure that the rules of the game are explained clearly to all players before the start of the event.
9. The organiser must deploy umpires on site to referee the event and resolve any disputes.
10. The mahjong activities must be held indoors at the multi-purpose hall of Kampong Ubi Community Centre.
11. The organiser must ensure that all doors to the multi-purpose hall of Kampong Ubi Community Centre are closed during the event so as to minimise noise from the event.
12. The organiser must open up the premises for spot-checks by the police during the event.
13. The organiser must take all reasonable steps to ensure that there are no private deals or side-betting throughout the event.
