In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Motor Vehicles (Third-Party Risks and Compensation) Act, the Minister for Transport hereby makes the following Notification:

#### **Citation**

**1.** This Order may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Third-Party Risks and Compensation) (2010 FORMULA 1™ SingTel Singapore Grand Prix) (Exemption) Notification 2010.

#### **Definition**

**2.** In this Notification, “designated roads” means the racing circuit designated and approved for use by the Fédération Internationale de l’Automobile, the Singapore Tourism Board and the Land Transport Authority of Singapore for the purpose of the Fédération Internationale de l’Automobile Formula One World Championship 2010 and the roads that fall within the area surrounded by the racing circuit, which is more particularly shown in the Schedule.

## **Exemption**

**3.—(1)** Section 3 of the Act shall not apply in relation to the use of any motor vehicle —


- (a) for the purpose of the Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile Formula One World Championship 2010 in Singapore within the designated roads; and
- (b) when there is in force a policy of insurance in relation to that motor vehicle insuring the owner of the motor vehicle or such other person (as may be specified in the policy) who drives the motor vehicle jointly and each of them severally against any liability which may be incurred by the owner or that other person jointly or by either of them severally, in respect of the death of or bodily injury to any person caused by or arising out of the use of the motor vehicle in Singapore.

(2) The exemption referred to in sub-paragraph (1) shall be valid from 22nd September 2010 to 28th September 2010 (both dates inclusive).
