In exercise of the powers conferred by section 24 of the Common Gaming Houses Act, the Minister for Home Affairs hereby makes the following Notification:

**Citation**

1. This Notification may be cited as the Common Gaming Houses (Exemption) (No. 61) Notification 2014.

**Exemption**

2.—(1) The Minister hereby exempts Kampong Ubi Senior Citizens' Executive Committee (called the organiser) from the provisions of the Act in respect of —

- (a) the “Kampong Ubi SCEC Mahjong Match” promotion to be held from 17 September 2014 to 28 September 2014 (both dates inclusive); and
- (b) the mahjong games to be held at the multi-purpose hall of Kampong Ubi Community Centre as part of that promotion from 9.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. on 28 September 2014.

(2) The exemption is subject to compliance by the organiser with the conditions specified in the Schedule.

## THE SCHEDULE

Paragraph 2

### CONDITIONS

1. The only game played must be mahjong.
2. All players must be at least 21 years of age and residing in the Marine Parade Group Representation Constituency, and all spectators and staff must be at least 21 years of age.
3. Prize sponsors must not be involved in any business related to gambling.
4. Advertising for the mahjong competition must be confined to posters and banners displayed within such area within the Marine Parade Group Representation Constituency as is designated by the organiser to be the Kampong Ubi district.
5. The organiser may charge an entrance fee of \$20 to cover the cost of hosting the mahjong competition, less the value of the prizes.
6. Token prizes can be allowed in recognition of the skills shown by the winners.
7. The organiser must ensure that the rules of the game are explained clearly to all players before the start of the event.
8. The organiser must deploy umpires on site to referee the event and resolve any disputes.
9. The mahjong activities must be held indoors at the multi-purpose hall of Kampong Ubi Community Centre.
10. The multi-purpose hall of Kampong Ubi Community Centre must have adequate sound-proofing to minimise noise pollution.
11. The organiser must open up the premises for spot-checks by the police during the event.
12. The organiser must take all reasonable steps to ensure that there are no private deals or side-betting throughout the event.
