## ENVIRONMENTAL PUBLIC HEALTH ACT (CHAPTER 95)

# ENVIRONMENTAL PUBLIC HEALTH (PUBLIC CLEANSING) (AMENDMENT NO. 2) REGULATIONS 2013

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 111 of the Environmental Public Health Act, the National Environment Agency, with the approval of the Minister for the Environment and Water Resources, hereby makes the following Regulations:

### **Citation and commencement**

**1.**—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Environmental Public Health (Public Cleansing) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations 2013 and shall, with the exception of regulation 2(c) and (d), come into operation on 1st October 2013.

- (2) Regulation 2(c) shall come into operation on 1st March 2014.
- (3) Regulation 2(d) shall come into operation on 1st January 2014.

## **Amendment of Second Schedule**

2. The Second Schedule to the Environmental Public Health (Public Cleansing) Regulations (Rg 3) is amended —

- (*a*) by deleting sub-paragraph (1) of paragraphs 3, 4 and 5 and substituting in each case the following sub-paragraph:
  - "(1) Domestic premises provided with —
    (a) direct refuse collection\$24.81 per premises
    - (b) indirect refuse collection \$7.49 per premises.";

(*b*) by deleting sub-paragraphs (2) and (3) of paragraph 5 and substituting the following sub-paragraphs:
