In exercise of the powers conferred by section 26(1) of the Endangered Species (Import and Export) Act, the Minister for National Development makes the following Order:

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order is the Endangered Species (Import and Export) (Display of Elephant Ivory — Exemption) Order 2021 and comes into operation on 1 September 2021.

**Definition**

2. In this Order, “elephant ivory” means any tusk or tooth from a specimen of *Elephas maximus* (Asian elephant) or *Loxodonta africana* (African elephant), whether worked, unworked or prepared, or any part, powder or waste of that tusk or tooth.

**Exemption**

3. Section 4(3) of the Act does not apply to the display of any elephant ivory to the public for educational or religious purposes.
