Design of Obverse	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The background of the \$2 nickel-plated zinc proof-like coin and the \$5 silver proof colour coin is shiny silver.</li> <li>2. The Singapore Coat of Arms is engraved in the centre of the coin with the year-date “2021” below it.</li> <li>3. The word “SINGAPORE” appears once in each of the 4 official languages and is engraved on the coin around the Singapore Coat of Arms.</li> </ol>

	<p>4. The mintmark is engraved on the coin around the Singapore Coat of Arms at 5 o'clock for the \$5 silver proof colour coin.</p>
Design of Reverse	<p>1. The background of the \$2 nickel-plated zinc proof-like coin and the \$5 silver proof colour coin is shiny silver.</p> <p>2. The words “HAWKER CULTURE IN SINGAPORE” are engraved on the upper circumference with the words “UNESCO INTANGIBLE CULTURAL HERITAGE OF HUMANITY” engraved on the lower circumference of the coin.</p> <p>3. The \$2 nickel-plated zinc proof-like coin and the \$5 silver proof colour coin share a common design which features —</p> <p>(a) in the foreground — 3 male hawkers and one female hawker from diverse cultural backgrounds preparing the following local favourites (in clockwise direction from the top-left hawker):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) Hokkien Mee (fried prawn noodles);</li> <li>(ii) Nasi Lemak (fragrant rice cooked in coconut milk, served with fried chicken, egg, anchovies, peanuts, cucumber and sambal);</li> <li>(iii) Kaya Toast accompanied with soft-boiled eggs and Kopi (coffee); and</li> <li>(iv) Roti Prata (Indian flatbread served with curry) and Indian Rojak; and</li> </ul> <p>(b) in the background and all in engraving —</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) patrons, young and old, enjoying their meals in a hawker centre setting, are depicted in the left and centre;</li> <li>(ii) a chicken rice stall is depicted on the right; and</li> </ul>

	<p>(iii) a tray return rack is depicted to the left of the chicken rice stall.</p> <p>4. The \$2 nickel-plated zinc proof-like coin also features —</p> <p>(a) its foreground minted in relief engraving; and</p> <p>(b) the denomination “\$2” engraved and placed at 6 o’clock, between the male and female hawkers.</p> <p>5. The \$5 silver proof colour coin also features —</p> <p>(a) its foreground in colour; and</p> <p>(b) the denomination “\$5” engraved and placed at 6 o’clock, between the male and female hawkers.</p>
