In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4(1)(b) of the Extradition Act 1968, the Minister for Law makes the following Notification:

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Notification is the Extradition (International Convention for Suppression of Terrorist Bombings) Notification 2022 and comes into operation on 1 July 2022.

#### **Definitions**

- 2. In this Notification
  - "Convention country" has the meaning given by section 2 of the Terrorism (Suppression of Bombings) Act 2007;
  - "relevant offence" has the meaning given by section 6(8) of the Terrorism (Suppression of Bombings) Act 2007.

# Application of Extradition Act 1968 to Convention countries

**3.** For the purposes of section 40(1) of the Extradition Act 1968 and section 6(5) of the Terrorism (Suppression of Bombings) Act 2007, the Extradition Act 1968 (except for Parts 5 and 6) applies in relation to any Convention country specified in the Schedule in respect of any person accused of or convicted of a relevant offence of that country.

### Cancellation

**4.** The Extradition (International Convention for Suppression of Terrorist Bombings) Notification 2010 (G.N. No. S 691/2010) is cancelled.
