**1.** This Order is the Infrastructure Protection (Protected Places) (No. 9) Order 2020 and comes into operation on 17 April 2020.

#### Premises declared to be protected place

2. The premises described in the second column of the Schedule are declared to be a protected place for the purposes of the Act, and the person specified in the first column of that Schedule is designated as the authority of the protected place.


