REMOTE GAMBLING ACT 2014 (ACT 34 OF 2014)

REMOTE GAMBLING (HEALTH PROMOTION BOARD — EXEMPTION) (NO. 2) ORDER 2020

ARRANGEMENT OF PARAGRAPHS

Paragraph

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In exercise of the powers conferred by section 40 of the Remote Gambling Act 2014, the Minister for Home Affairs makes the following Order:

Citation

1. This Order is the Remote Gambling (Health Promotion Board — Exemption) (No. 2) Order 2020.

Definitions

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires —

“draw” means the draw to be held as part of the promotion at 3 Second Hospital Avenue, Singapore 168937 at 4 p.m. on 21 September 2020;

“organiser” means the Health Promotion Board established by section 3 of the Health Promotion Board Act (Cap. 122B);

“promotion” means the promotion called “Great Data Dash with Singtel Challenge” that is to be made available from 6 July 2020 to 31 August 2020 (both dates inclusive) on the

Healthy 365 mobile application platform maintained by the organiser;

“public accountant” has the meaning given by section 2(1) of the Accountants Act (Cap. 2).

Exemption

3.—(1) The organiser is exempt from sections 11, 13, 15 and 17 of the Act in respect of the promotion and the draw.

(2) The exemption is subject to compliance by the organiser with the conditions specified in the Schedule.

THE SCHEDULE

Paragraph 3(2)

CONDITIONS

1. All the following details must be included in publicity material that must be freely accessible to every participant of the draw:
 - (a) the name and address of the organiser;
 - (b) the details of the prizes to be distributed;
 - (c) the manner in which the prizes will be distributed;
 - (d) the time, date and place of the draw;
 - (e) how a person may participate in the draw;
 - (f) the manner in which the draw is to be conducted.
2. The organiser must keep a record of the name and email address of every participant of the draw.
3. Only persons in the employment of the organiser may conduct the draw.
4. The draw must —
 - (a) be conducted in public; or
 - (b) if conducted in private by means of a computerised system, be witnessed and audited by a public accountant who is not in the employment of the organiser.
5. The organiser must undertake to ensure that every winner is notified by email or telephone.

THE SCHEDULE — *continued*

6. The organiser must, before the start of the draw, undertake to ensure that an audited statement of accounts and the results of the draw are sent by registered post to the Head, Specialised Crime Policy Branch, Criminal Investigation Department, Singapore Police Force, no later than 22 December 2020.
