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In exercise of the powers conferred by section 40 of the Remote Gambling Act 2014, the Minister for Home Affairs makes the following Order:

**Citation**

1. This Order is the Remote Gambling (National Library Board — Exemption) Order 2020.

**Definitions**

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires —

“draw” means any draw to be held as part of the promotion at National Library Building, 100 Victoria Street, Singapore 188064 at 10 a.m. on the following dates:

- (a) 1 March 2021;
- (b) 31 May 2021;
- (c) 30 August 2021;

“organiser” means the National Library Board established by section 3 of the National Library Board Act (Cap. 197);

“promotion” means the promotion called “Book Bugs: Explorers of Stories Past Bug-a-thon” that is to be made available from 1 December 2020 to 30 August 2021 (both dates inclusive) on —

(a) the following mobile applications:

- (i) NLB Mobile;
- (ii) OverDrive;
- (iii) Libby, by OverDrive; and

(b) the following websites:

- (i) <https://catalogue.nlb.gov.sg>;
- (ii) <https://nlb.overdrive.com>;
- (iii) <https://libbyapp.com/library/nlb>;

“public accountant” has the meaning given by section 2(1) of the Accountants Act (Cap. 2).

### **Exemption**

3.—(1) The organiser is exempt from sections 11, 13, 15 and 17 of the Act in respect of the promotion and the draws.

(2) The exemption is subject to compliance by the organiser with the conditions specified in the Schedule.

## THE SCHEDULE

Paragraph 3(2)

### CONDITIONS

1. All the following details must be included in publicity material that must be freely accessible to every participant of a draw:
  - (a) the name and address of the organiser;
  - (b) the details of the prizes to be distributed;
  - (c) the manner in which the prizes will be distributed;
  - (d) the time, date and place of the draw;

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THE SCHEDULE — *continued*

- (e) how a person may participate in the draw;
  - (f) the manner in which the draw is to be conducted.
2. The organiser must keep a record of the name, contact number and email address of every participant of a draw.
  3. Only persons in the employment of the organiser may conduct a draw.
  4. Each draw must —
    - (a) be conducted in a manner where members of the public or a section of the public may witness the draw; or
    - (b) if conducted in private by means of a computerised system, be witnessed and audited by a public accountant who is not in the employment of the organiser.
  5. The organiser must undertake to ensure that every winner is notified by email and a text message that is sent using a short message service (SMS).
  6. The organiser must, before the start of the draws, undertake to ensure that an audited statement of accounts and the results of the draws are sent by registered post to the Head, Specialised Crime Policy Branch, Criminal Investigation Department, Singapore Police Force, no later than 1 December 2021.
