In exercise of the powers conferred by section 81B of the Trade Marks Act, the Minister for Finance makes the following Rules:

Citation and commencement

1. These Rules are the Trade Marks (Border Enforcement Measures Fees) Rules 2019 and come into operation on 21 November 2019.

Definition

2. In these Rules, “seized goods” means goods that were seized by an authorised officer under section 82(4) or 93A(1) of the Act.

Fees

3. The fees specified in the second column of the Schedule are payable to the Director-General in respect of the matters set out opposite in the first column of that Schedule.

THE SCHEDULE

FEES

<i>First column</i>	<i>Second column</i>
1. For the processing of a written notice mentioned in section 82(1) or 93B(1)(a) of the Act	\$200
2. For the escort of a conveyance conveying seized goods	\$20 per half hour (or part of half hour) of a continuous operation
3. For the attendance of an authorised officer or a senior authorised officer in connection with —	
(a) the inspection of seized goods	\$20 per half hour (or part of half hour) of a continuous operation
(b) the destruction of seized goods	\$40 per half hour (or part of half hour) of a continuous operation
4. For the attendance of an authorised officer or a senior authorised officer in connection with any other act or service under Part X of the Act	\$20 per half hour (or part of half hour) of a continuous operation
